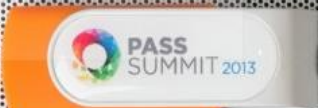

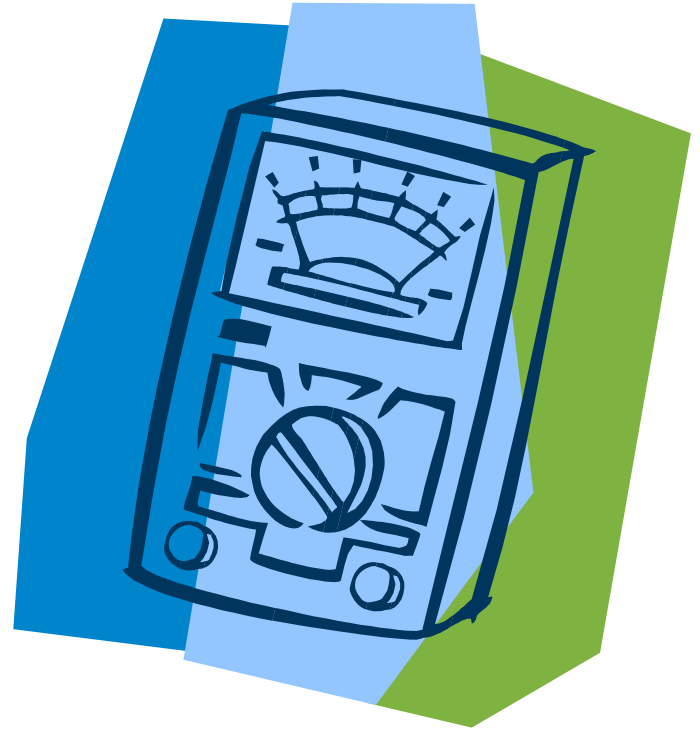

Common Problems In Large Report Catalogs

- Different departments have slightly different layouts for the same data as other departments
- Multiple reports that differ only on the amount of data that users need
 - Manager needs all data summarized
 - Everyone else needs the details of their data
- Long reports that are cumbersome to move around
- One off reports

Solutions to minimize and streamline the report catalog

- Create a Report Catalog Summary report
 - Provides metrics on use AND lack of use of reports
 - Provides metrics on HOW reports are used
 - Provides metrics on WHO is using reports
- Leverage windows authentication to reduce data
- Group similar reports into a single report that has a dynamic layout based on user
- Provide various forms of navigation to move around giant reports.

Demo Take Away

- Create metrics to find out your most heavily used reports
- Create metrics to find out your least used reports
 - These reports may be candidates for decommissioning
 - Make sure these are not sparsely used reports
- Create metrics for most resource intensive reports
 - Intensive for retrieving data
 - Intensive for rendering

Demo Take Away

- When severely reducing or upgrading your report catalog, make sure to keep track of reports that are decommissioned
 - Sometimes they need to be re-commissioned
 - You can report to your manager on your progress

Demo Take Away

- Filter data based on user login by leveraging the User!UserID property.
- The user login can be used to filter other parameters too
 - Warning: Filtering parameters with other parameters can slow the report down
- Change layout by determining information about the user by leveraging their login

- Bookmarks can provide a short “table of contents” at the beginning or ending of a report
- Can allow users to move around lengthy reports quickly and efficiently

- Can provide simple metrics for report
- Can provide a simple summary of the report

 - Cuts down on the number of reports you have to manage
